
~ NORTH OGDEN CHERRY DAYS ~

SEWER BACKED UP? - What to do if a backup occurs- First, take action to protect people and valuable property. You may call the City at 782-8111 during business hours or 782-7211 after hours, and as a courtesy service we will check the main sewer line. Any blockages found in the main lines will be promptly cleared. If the main line is not blocked, we recommend that you call a plumbing or sewer contractor to check your lateral line. Maintenance and repair of the lateral serving the home is the homeowner's responsibility.

Clean-up of the home should be done as soon as possible to minimize damage and possible negative health effects. There are qualified local businesses that specialize in this type of clean up.

Back Up Prevention-Taking notice of what is flushed down toilets and sinks can prevent most backups. **DO NOT** flush the following materials (or similar items) down toilets/drains. These items can plug the main and cause damage to you and other property owners connected to the main.

- Large quantities of toilet paper
- Paper towels
- Feminine napkins (plastic applicators)
- Disposable diapers
- Clothing-socks, underwear, etc.
- Plastic, metal, wood, etc.
- Large quantities of cereals or grains (they can swell with water)
- Live seeds, beans, and peas (they may sprout)
- Grease, fats, oils
- Sand
- Fibrous materials (cotton balls, q-tips, baby wipes, hair, rags, cigarette butts, etc)
- Sponges, scouring pads, shop rags



Thank you for taking the time to protect you and your fellow property owners.

We are fortunate to live in a city with its beautiful surroundings and spectacular views. With those mountains and views come hillsides, slopes, and steep grades, which require detention ponds to slow the flow of water from running out of the city too fast. There are over 30 detention ponds throughout the city and chances are that you may live close to one of them. We are asking for your consideration and cooperation in maintaining those ponds by not using them for your refuse (limbs, grass, animal waste, etc.). Your refuse causes added work for the 2-person maintenance team and limits the proper flow of water in the ponds. Thank you!

Pineview water is on for the season as of April 15th and once again we are asked to conserve water by not watering between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Water costs money... don't waste it! A dripping faucet or fixture can waste 3 gallons a day...a total of 1,095 gallons a year

Spring and summer are traditionally the time of year when North Ogden sees a spike in the number of thefts and damaged property cases being reported to our officers. With the warmer weather, people tend to leave doors and windows open. Bicycles, lawn mowers, and other valuables are also left outside unattended more often during this time of year. With the warmer weather, criminals tend to stay out later. We wish to remind everyone to secure your property so it does not disappear and make note of the serial numbers on your belongings in case they do. It only takes seconds for a criminal to steal what took you hours or longer to earn. Plus, there's the added loss of security victims often feel knowing that a criminal has invaded their space and rummaged through their belongings. Don't make things easy for them. The NOPD has tips and information that can help residents reduce the likelihood of them becoming the next crime victim. If you are interested in having an officer come and speak with your neighborhood or group, we invite you to call our office at 801-782-7219 during regular business hours and ask for Detective Rhoades to schedule a time.

On a side note, I was recently at the Customer Service Desk at one of our area stores. There was a citizen ahead of me in line filling out a request with the money transfer company to try and get several hundred dollars back that he had wired overseas. When asked where he sent the money, this person somewhat sheepishly informed the clerk that he had wired the money to Nigeria, and that he had a feeling he shouldn't have done it. Law Enforcement gets calls all too regularly regarding these types of fraud. I assure you that there is not a wealthy member of a royal family somewhere needing your help getting their money out of the country. Sorry, but if you have not been to another country recently and bought a ticket, you have not won their lottery. And, if someone calls and claims to be an attorney representing a family member who has been arrested overseas, no matter who they say they are or who they represent, before you send money or give your information, contact other family members to make sure that the "arrested" person is indeed in that other country and is indeed in trouble. We've had residents call their children to do a little fact checking about a supposedly arrested grandchild, only to find that the grandchild in question was sitting at home with the rest of the family and not in some jail cell in a foreign country.
