**EARLY VOTING BEGINS TUESDAY, OCTOBER 23, 2012 AND CONTINUES WEEKDAYS THROUGH FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 2012 BETWEEN 9AM AND 5PM IN THE NORTH OGDEN CITY COUNCIL ROOM.**

**In order to vote during early voting, voters must present valid voter identification.** This is either a form of identification that bears the name and photograph of the voter or two forms of identification that bear the name of the voter and provide evidence of the voter's residence.

**In Utah, these forms of identification include:**

1. A currently valid Utah driver license;
2. A currently valid ID card issued by the state or a branch, department, or agency of the United States;
3. A currently valid Utah permit to carry a concealed weapon;
4. A currently valid United States passport; or
5. A valid tribal ID card, whether or not the card includes a photograph of the voter.

**Or**

**TWO forms of identification that bear the name of the voter and provide evidence that the voter resides in the voting precinct, which may include:**

1. A current utility bill or copy thereof dated within 90 days before the election;
2. A bank or other financial account statement, or legible copy thereof;
3. A certified birth certificate;
4. A valid Social Security card.

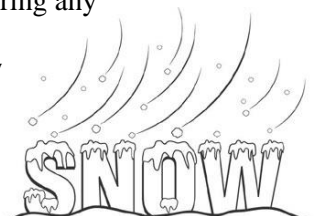


In preparation for the snowplow season  
we are asking homeowners to trim their  
trees and branches hanging over the road  
and sidewalks to a height of 9’ measured  
from the top of the curb. This allows our snowplow  
drivers to clear the road more effectively. If there are low  
hanging branches on your property the plow trucks will be  
forced to swerve around them leaving large amounts of  
snow on the road in front of your home.



While driving around town we have  
noticed several basketball hoops in the  
street and left on the park strips.  
Basketball hoops are not allowed to be in  
the street or on the park strips. They need  
to be kept on one’s own property.

The winter parking ordinance goes into effect again on  
November 15, 2012 and runs through March 15, 2013. It  
is unlawful for the owner of any vehicle to park on any  
public street between the hours of midnight and 6a. It is  
also unlawful for the owner of any vehicle to be parked on  
any public street or roadway during any  
snowstorm or within 24 hours  
following the cessation of snow  
after any snowstorm. We  
appreciate your cooperation  
with these issues.

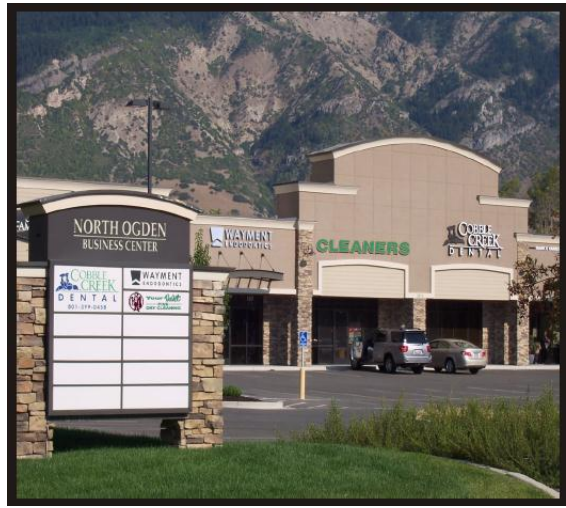

Green Waste Pick-Up is scheduled for October 15-19, 2012; collection will be on your regular garbage day. The volume of material may; however, delay collection. The regulations mentioned below must be followed when placing material out for collection.

All materials must be in bags, boxes or containers. Bush clippings and small tree limbs must be bundled and no longer than 5 feet in length. Weight limit is 75 pounds. Place materials in parkways, not on the curb or in the waterways.

We appreciate citizen participation and encourage your use of the compost facility. For that reason the **compost facility will be open for your use at NO CHARGE the entire clean-up week (Mon – Fri) from 8a to 4:30p and Saturday from 9a to noon.**

#### HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Halloween will soon be upon us, with costumed children lurking in our neighborhoods. We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents of a few Halloween safety tips:

- > Select bright costumes, or costumes with reflective material, that will allow motorists and others to see your children
- > Do not select costumes that have weapons with sharp edges or pointed ends
- > Provide each child with a flashlight
- > All children should be accompanied by a trusted adult or older sibling
- > Remind children to cross the street at the corner and to look both ways before crossing
- > Only visit homes where you know the residents
- > Only go to homes where the porch light is on
- > Remind children not to enter homes or accept rides from strangers
- > Parents should inspect treats before allowing children to eat them
- > Do not accept opened or homemade treats from people you do not know and trust
- > Know who your neighbors are and who you can and cannot trust

In addition to these child safety tips, we would like to remind adults that there will be a lot of children in the neighborhoods. Some of these children may be difficult to see, or may dart out into the roadways. As you are driving, please be mindful of this possibility and exercise extra caution to avoid a possible tragedy.



#### COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

North Ogden City has a large number of CERT volunteers who have been trained to assist in the event of an emergency. We have been fortunate that we have not had to call on many of these valuable volunteers in recent years. We know, however, that it is only a matter of time before our luck runs out and we face a large scale emergency event. The North Ogden CERT Council is in the process of planning several refresher classes to help our volunteer corps maintain their CERT skills. **It's not too late to register for the Green Choices Challenge!**

If you have not signed up yet to participate in the challenge please take a few minutes to do so. The challenge runs through the end of the year so there is still plenty of time!

Once you are registered you will simply need to log on or call in weekly to report that you have recycled. Waste Management picks up the blue recycle cans every other week but every time you place recyclable materials in the can you are recycling so report your participation weekly.

RecycleBank tracks the participation of our residents each week only when you report online or by phone. Participation is not ranked by weight or the number of blue cans that are picked up.

Remember North Ogden City is competing with 49 other communities from around the country for a **\$100,000 grant!**

The Utah State Division of Aging and Adult Services hosted their annual Centenarian Luncheon in Sandy, UT on September 28<sup>th</sup>. 48 of the 125 centenarians in the state were present and Governor Gary Herbert and Lt. Governor Greg Bell visited with each of them individually.

There are thirteen centenarians in Weber County including Lawrence Todd, 101, of Ogden and Gaitha Butterfield, 100, of Pleasant View. The oldest man in Utah is Eldred G. Smith, 105, of Salt Lake City. The oldest woman is Mrs. Anna Mancuso, 108, of Murray.

Walter Bailey, 100, North Ogden resident and father of City Council Member Kent Bailey, is the oldest man in the City and the second oldest man in Weber County. He attended the luncheon and is shown below with Governor Gary Herbert. He was born June 3, 1912 on Elberta Drive and raised in North Ogden. He attended North Ogden Elementary and graduated from Weber High in 1930. Walter worked many different jobs during the Depression and married Margaret Harding of Willard, Utah in 1937. They were together until her death in 2004 at age 93. Until her death they were often seen walking in North Ogden with her hand in his back pocket for balance. Walter still walks nearly every day – something he has done for the past 35 years.

Walter and Margaret had 3 sons and 1 daughter who blessed them with 18 grandchildren, 57 great grandchildren, and 4 great-great grandchildren. He is in great health both physically and mentally. He loves BYU football and Utah Jazz basketball, and attends church every week.
