This summer, North Ogden City residents have experienced an unusually high number of thefts and burglaries. Within the past week, North Ogden citizens have reported eleven thefts or burglaries in the city. In ten of those cases, it was determined that the property had been left unsecured, the garage left open, or the vehicle left unlocked. Criminals will often wander through our neighborhoods late at night, while the residents are asleep and the darkness allows for easy concealment, checking for unlocked cars and rummaging through open garages. We would like to remind everyone that thieves often do what they do because they see an easy opportunity or they do not want to work hard for what they want. Please do not make things easy for these criminals by leaving property unsecured and easily accessible to these thieves.



On a separate note, the summer fireworks season is over. Hopefully, all of you have had a safe and enjoyable 4th and 24th of July holiday. This season has been unusually dry, and the risk of wildfire still exists. Please put off lighting any additional fireworks. The North Ogden Police Department and North View Fire District will continue to enforce fireworks-related laws in the city. Also, restrict open fires to designated areas. There have been enough wildfires in the news already, and we would hate to see lives and property lost in our area due to the careless actions of our neighbors.

We would like to thank all of you for everything you do to keep this city safe, and to make this such a great place in which to work and live.

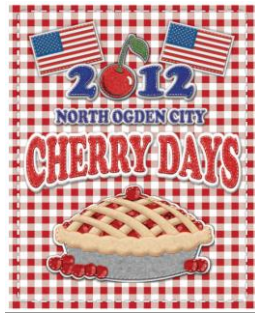

This will be a wonderful evening and a great way to start off the Arts Festival weekend.

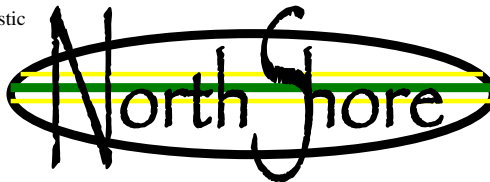

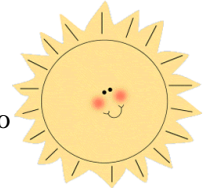

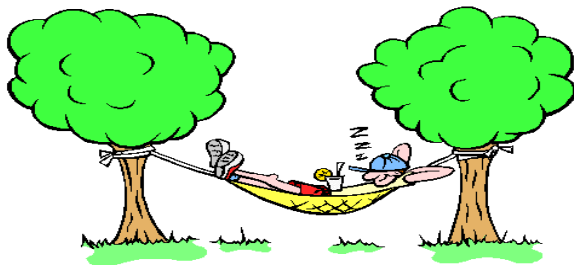

We would like to recognize all of our citizens for doing such a great job helping us get through this very hot and dry firework season. As most of you know we had the large fire which burned just over six acres and threatened some homes, but with a quick response and fast action from us and our mutual aid we were able to stop it before any damages were sustained. We had some smaller fires during this season as well, but a lot of them were reported very early to help us get a jump on them, or they were out by the time we got there.



We had several citizens talk to neighbors when they were lighting off fireworks in restricted areas. This was a huge help to us because we just don't have the resources to be everywhere. We also had concerned community members who took the restrictions, made copies of them, and took them door to door in their neighborhoods to help make people aware of the dangers. We would also like to thank our police departments and their cooperation and help that they gave to us. They took care of many complaints and helped us enforce the restrictions. Most of all we would like to thank you.

Although we have escaped major incidents up to this point our fire season is far from over. Even though the window for fireworks is over there are many other things that can cause fires and the dangerous fire conditions are only going to worsen as we move further into the summer. So please don't let your guard down and continue your vigilance in helping us patrol your neighborhoods, especially in the interface areas. We wish you a safe rest of your summer.
