In these tough financial times, it is an unfortunate reality that the North Ogden Police Department frequently receives complaints from residents who have been victims of frauds or scams. These frauds generally range from money transfers to work-from-home scams to payments for services not rendered. Do not voluntarily surrender your hard earned money unless you are certain of what you are receiving in return. Below is a list of common frauds committed in our area:

- Relationship scams: Victims wire money to someone they have formed a relationship with. These relationships are generally formed online and the victim does not really know the suspect personally. Remember, anyone can go online and claim to be whoever they want you to believe they are.
- Arrest scams: Someone calls the victim, claiming to be a family member who is in legal trouble. The suspect then requests that the victim wire money to help him or her out. It is common in these situations that the suspect either requests that the transfer be made immediately or that the victim not tell anyone what's going on.
- Work-from-home scams: People seeking employment find offers to work from home. The new employer then sends a check or money order to the victim, instructing them to cash the check and wire a portion of the money to another person. It is not until after the money is forwarded that the victim learns that the check was fraudulent.
- Online sales scam: You attempt to sell an item through a newspaper or online. A "buyer" then sends a money order in excess of the agreed-upon price and asks that the seller wire the excess funds to another person. The money order is later determined to be fraudulent and the victim is out the money they forwarded as well as the property they were attempting to sell.
- Handyman scam: Victims are approached by someone offering to do work for the resident. They are asked to pay upfront for labor or materials. The scam artist then leaves the area with the money, without performing the agreed-upon services.

We understand times are tough for a lot of people right now. Do not surrender your hard-earned money without doing a lot of fact-checking to confirm what you are being told. If you receive one of these offers, contact a trusted family member or the police department before sending any money. Unfortunately once you transfer your money elsewhere it is difficult, if not impossible, to get the money back.

## NORTH VIEW FIRE DISTRICT – 782-8159 – 315 E 2550 N

Although our temperatures this winter have been unseasonably mild, we are all aware that our temperatures can change drastically in a short amount of time. The following is some information about the causes and costs of heating equipment fires and some safety tips to help us keep our families safe and warm.

According to NFPA in 2009 heating equipment was involved in an estimated 58,900 reported US home fires. These fires accounted for over \$1 billion of property damage and 1,520 civilian injuries and 480 deaths.

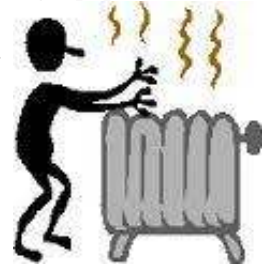
Space heaters accounted for one-third of home heating fires. The leading factor contributing to home heating fires was failure to clean the tarry buildup called creosote from chimneys.

Nearly half of all home heating fires occurred in the months of December, January and February.

### Safety Tips

- Keep anything flammable at least three feet from heating equipment, such as the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three foot “kid-free zone” around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer’s instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Make sure your fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room.
- Test your smoke alarms monthly and change the batteries twice a year.

#### GREEN WASTE PICK UP

The City has scheduled the spring Green Waste Pick Up for April 30-May 4, 2012; collection will be on your regular garbage day. The volume of material may; however, delay collection a day or two.

The following regulations **MUST** be followed when placing material out for collection. All materials must be in boxes, bundled with string or bagged. Bush clippings and small tree limbs must be bundled and no longer than 5 feet in length. Weight limit is 75 pounds. Place materials in the park strip, not in curb or waterways. **This is a Green Waste Clean Up Only.**

**The compost facility is open at no cost this week from 8:00am to 4:00pm in addition to the regular volunteer hours on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday.**

#### SANDBAGS/FLOOD BAGS

The city has two types of sandbags available for purchase: The recycled plastic sandbags are disposable and measure 15" x 20". The city will provide the sand for the sandbags but the residents should be prepared to fill the sandbags themselves, during regular business hours. The cost of these sandbags is \$.50 each. The flood bags are a heavy plastic reusable bag. Instead of using sand to fill the flood bag it uses water. The flood bags measure 22" x 16". Included with the initial purchase of the reusable flood bags comes a gel package for each bag. The gel packet is an optional addition to the water in the flood for a gelatin-like consistency. The cost of these flood bags is \$3.50 each. \*Note-we have heard that these bags are also great for food storage such as rice, beans and sugar.

Either of these types of bags can be purchased at the city office located at 505 East 2600 North during regular business hours.
