North Ogden is fortunate each year to get our fair share of snowfall. While this leads to beautiful scenery after the storm and provides us with water for the remainder of the year, it also leads to numerous accidents and injuries. North Ogden City's Winter Parking ordinance is in effect from November 15th to March 15th. This ordinance prohibits on street parking between the hours of midnight and 6:00 A.M., as well as during or within 24 hours following the cessation of snow after a snowstorm (N.O.O. 7-3-4).

Enforcement of this ordinance allows city crews to remove snow from the roadways in order to keep our streets passable and safe. Unfortunately, each year residents report that their parked vehicles have been damaged by passing snowplows that were in the area clearing our roads. Many residents also awake to find that they have received citations or that their vehicles have been deemed a public nuisance and towed away. It is also each property owner's responsibility to remove the snow from the sidewalks in front of their property. It is unlawful, however, to discharge this snow into the street (N.O.O. 8-4-1, N.O.O. 8-4-2). Snow that is allowed to accumulate on sidewalks becomes a serious safety hazard to pedestrians, and snow discharged into the street leads to icy or slushy patches that become hazards to passing motorists. Please be mindful of others and keep the areas adjacent to your property clear of ice and snow so we can all remain safe this winter.

PUBLIC WORKS DIVISIONS

STREETS: The Street Maintenance Division is
 responsible for street maintenance and repair; sidewalk
 and curb maintenance; street sign installation and
 maintenance; traffic line and legend installation and
 maintenance.

CULINARY WATER: The Culinary Water Division is
 responsible for the collection, treatment and distribution
 of water to the entire city. The division operates within
 strict federal guidelines and is acknowledged as one of the
 best water systems in the state.

SANITARY SEWER: The Sewer Maintenance Division
 is responsible for maintaining the City's system of sewer
 lines, cleaning sewer lines, recording lines for
 maintenance and repair needs.

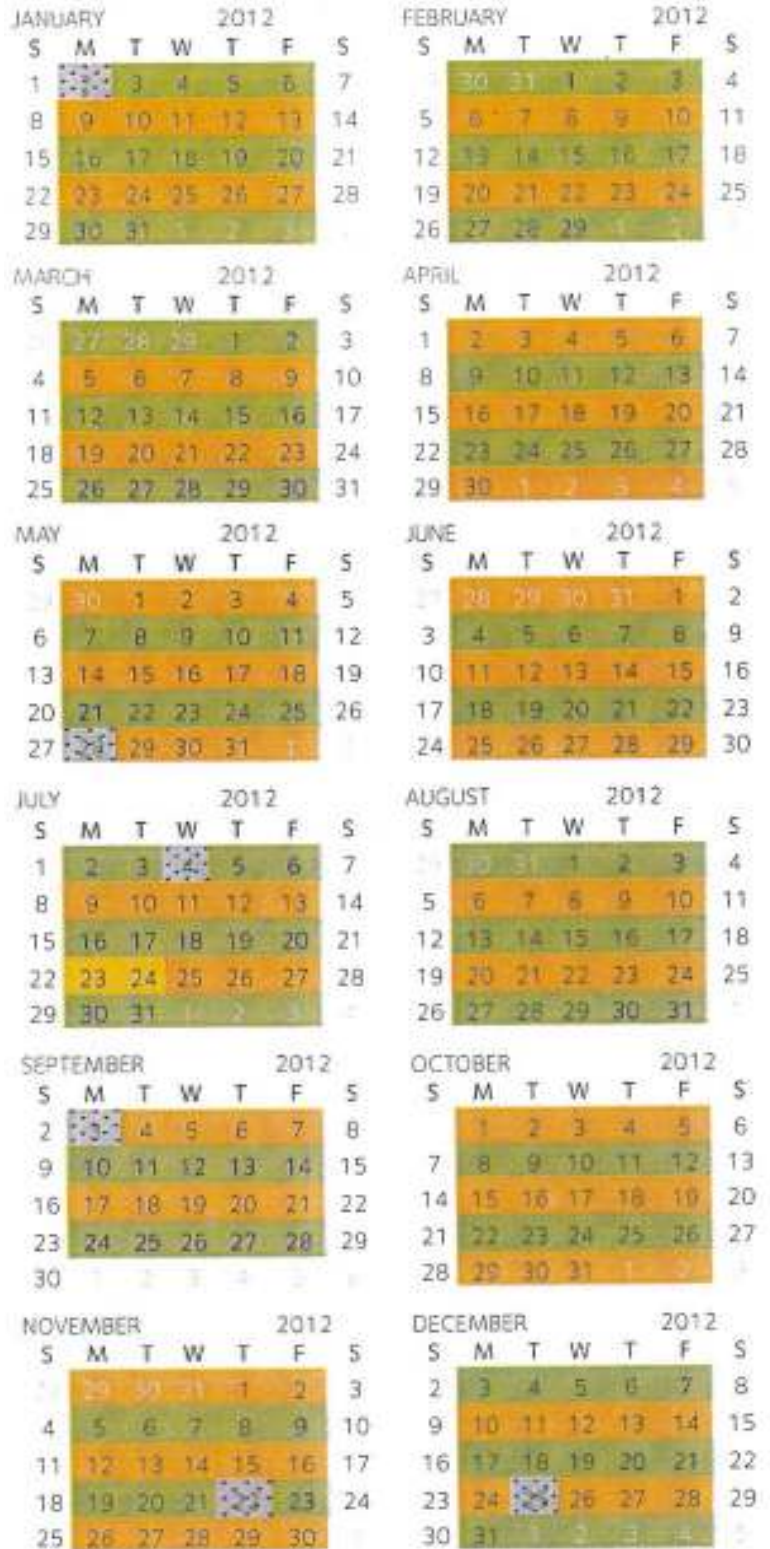
STORM DRAIN: The Storm Drain Division is
 responsible for all drain line inspection and maintenance,
 the maintenance and grooming of all the City's detention
 basins, monitoring and controlling runoff waters.

SOLID WASTE: The Solid Waste Division is
 responsible for the delivery and pick up of all receptacles,
 the maintenance, repair and replacement of receptacles.
 Refuse collection is contracted to Waste Management of
 Utah (801-731-5052).

VEHICLE SHOP: The Vehicle Shop Division is
 responsible for the maintenance and repair of all City-
 owned vehicles from the smallest of tools, such as, weed
 eaters and lawnmowers to the largest equipment, like the
 dump trucks, backhoe and loader.

ADMINISTRATION: The Public Works Administration
 is responsible for the supervision of all projects in all
 divisions within the Public Works Department.
 Additionally, all the paperwork generated is funneled
 through this division for recording and tracking.

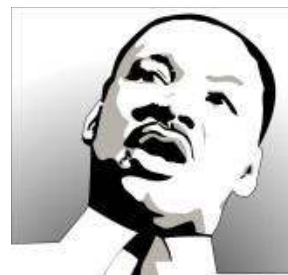
